

Just of Interest

A circular issued by the police department of Houston, Texas, which is both a warning and an accusation:

For Parents: How to Make a Child into a Delinquent-12 Easy Rules

- 1. Begin at infancy to give the child everything he wants. In this way he will grow up to believe the world owes him a living.
- 2. When he picks up bad language, laugh at him. This will make him think he's cute.
- 3. Never give him spiritual training. Wait until he is twenty-one and then [let] him "decide for himself."
- 4. Avoid the use of the word "wrong." It may develop a guilt complex. This will condition him to believe later, when he is arrested for stealing a car, that society is against him and he is being persecuted.
- 5. Pick up everything he leaves lying around: books, shoes, clothes. Do everything for him so that he will be experienced in throwing all responsibility on others.
- 6. Let him read any printed matter he can get his hands on. Be careful that the silverware and drinking glasses are sterilized, but let his mind feast on garbage.
- 7. Quarrel frequently in the presence of your children. In this way they will not be too shocked when the home is broken up later.
- 8. Give a child all the spending money he wants. Never let him earn his own. Why should he have things as tough as you had them?
- 9. Satisfy his every craving for food, drink, and comfort. See that every sensual desire is gratified. Denial may lead to harmful frustration.
- 10. Take his part against neighbors, teachers, policemen. They are all prejudiced against your child.
- 11. When he gets into real trouble, apologize for yourself by saying: "I never could do anything with him."
- 12. Prepare for a life of grief. You will be likely to have it.
