The Journey to Easter: From Palms to an Empty Tomb

As the days lengthen and spring unfolds, we prepare our hearts for the most profound and joyful season of the Christian faith—Easter. The journey to Resurrection Sunday is marked by deep reflection, sacred traditions, and opportunities to walk alongside Jesus in His final days before His triumph over death.

Our Holy Week journey begins with Palm Sunday, when we recall Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. The crowds waved palm branches, shouting "Hosanna!" as they welcomed their Messiah. Yet, in their joy, they did not understand that Jesus' victory would not come through military conquest but through the self-giving love of the cross. As we wave our own palm branches, may we remember that true discipleship means following Christ not just in celebration, but also in sacrifice.

On Maundy Thursday, we remember Jesus' final meal with His disciples, the night He knelt to wash their feet and commanded them—and us—"to love one another as I have loved you." It is a time to reflect on humility, service, and the gift of Holy Communion. The bread and the cup remind us that Jesus gave Himself for us completely, calling us to do the same for one another.

Good Friday is the most solemn day of the Christian calendar, as we stand at the foot of the cross and witness Jesus' ultimate act of love. The weight of our sin was borne by the sinless One, and as darkness covered the land, we were given the greatest gift—the atonement that makes us whole. This day reminds us that hope often looks like despair before resurrection dawns.

The grave could not hold Him! Easter morning fills our hearts with the joy of resurrection, the triumph of light over darkness, and the assurance that death is not the end. In Christ, we are given new life, hope, and the promise of eternal fellowship with God. We also at Bethel break-the-fast between the Son-rise service and the traditional service.

For our children, the Easter season is often marked by laughter and excitement during the annual Easter Egg Hunt. Some may wonder—how does this tradition connect to our faith? Eggs have long symbolized new life, a perfect reflection of the resurrection. Just as a chick emerges from the egg, so too, did Jesus emerge from the tomb, breaking the barriers of death. As we watch our little ones search for hidden treasures, let us remember that we, too, are seekers—always searching for the grace, joy, and hope that Christ freely gives.

As we journey through this sacred season together, may our hearts be open to the depth of God's love and the power of resurrection hope. Come and worship with us this Easter season, and may we all be renewed in the promise of new life in Christ!




