"Expanding the Kingdom, Overcoming the World"

"For all those who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted" Luke 14:11

As we step into the month of March, we find ourselves in a season of transition. Winter's grip begins to loosen, and signs of new life emerge. This is the time when we reflect on the hardships we've endured, the challenges still ahead, and the way Christ calls us to respond—not by retreating in self-preservation, but by stepping forward in faith, humility, and love.

The Gospel of Luke is rich with stories of Jesus overcoming adversity, not by wielding power as the world does, but by leaning into His divine purpose. In Luke 4, Jesus begins His ministry after overcoming temptation in the wilderness. In Luke 22, He prays in the Garden of Gethsemane, facing the weight of the cross but choosing God's will over His own comfort. Adversity is part of our journey, but Christ shows us that our response should not be fear or withdrawal—it should be faith and movement.

Many of us face struggles: economic hardships, illness, discouragement in ministry, and even personal doubts. Yet, as a church, we are not called to stand still. We are called to grow, to expand our vision, and to trust that God is leading us into new opportunities for discipleship and service.

Luke 18:9-14 tells the story of the Pharisee and the tax collector—one full of pride, the other humble before God. This passage challenges us to recognize the dangers of self-centeredness, whether in leadership, relationships, or our spiritual lives. The world tells us to build ourselves up, to seek influence, and to ensure our own comfort before all else. But Jesus calls us to something greater: self-denial, servant leadership, and a heart oriented toward others. Narcissism is not just a personal issue—it is a cultural and spiritual one. When churches become focused on their own survival rather than their mission, when leaders prioritize status over service, and when individuals pursue personal gain at the expense of community, the church loses sight of its purpose. Jesus reminds us that true greatness comes in laying ourselves down for others.

Luke 16:19-31 recounts the story of the rich man and Lazarus—a powerful reminder that ignoring the needs of others has eternal consequences. Jesus speaks again and again about the necessity of caring for the least among us. Whether it is through direct service, advocating for justice, or simply refusing to turn a blind eye, the church must be the hands and feet of Christ in a world that too often looks away. As we look around our own community, who are the Lazaruses at our doorstep? Are we willing to see them, to serve them, to love them as Christ does? At Bethel UMC, we continue our outreach efforts, but we must always ask ourselves: What more can we do?

Expansion is not just about numbers—it is about impact. In Luke 5, Jesus calls His disciples to cast their nets into deeper waters. Their obedience leads to an overwhelming catch. What would happen if we stepped out in faith, believing that God is calling us into something bigger than what we can currently see?

At Bethel UMC, we are not content to simply maintain. We are called to grow in discipleship, in outreach, in generosity, and in boldness. This month, let's ask ourselves:

Where is God calling us to expand?

How can we reach more people with the message of Christ?

What steps can we take to move forward, even in the face of difficulty?

As we journey through Lent and approach Easter, may we remember that the story of resurrection is one of victory over all obstacles. Christ's kingdom is expanding, and He invites us to be part of it. Let's not stand still—let's move forward together.

Miss Teresa led us once more in the sub-making event. About 383 were made with help from the Lions, Volleyball, NBCF and the band.




Reach Shelter
